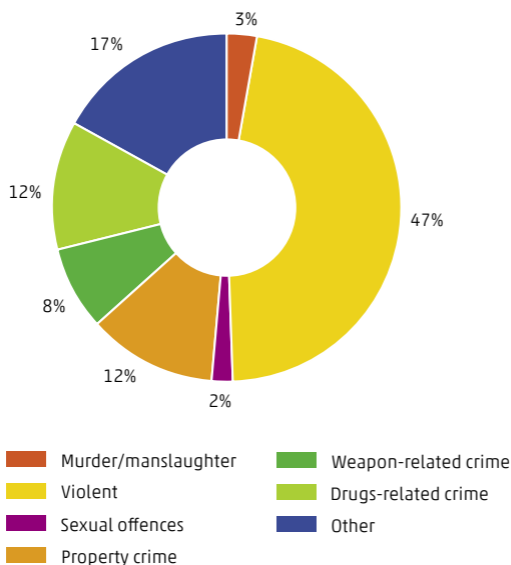

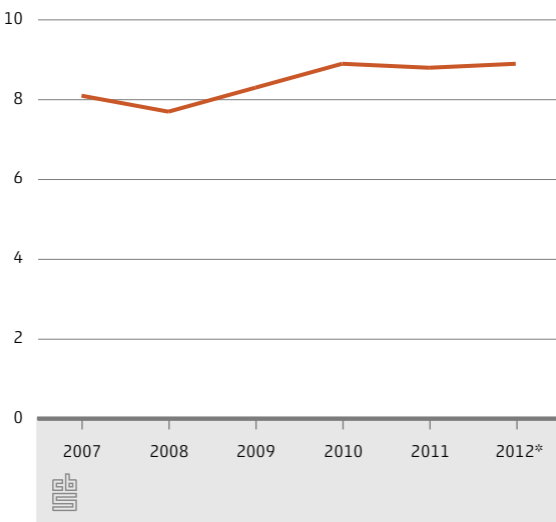

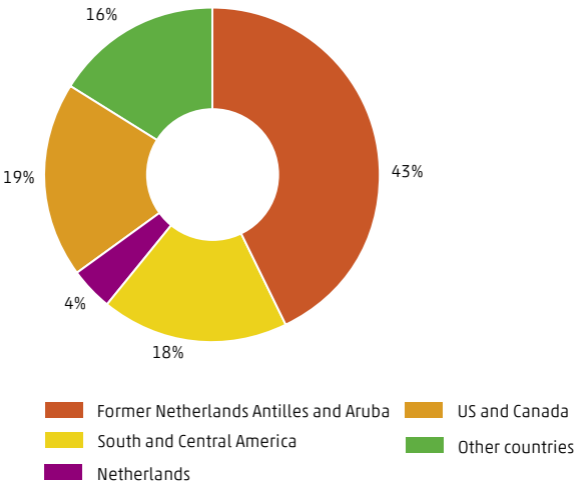

3.16 Age distribution Saba, 2013

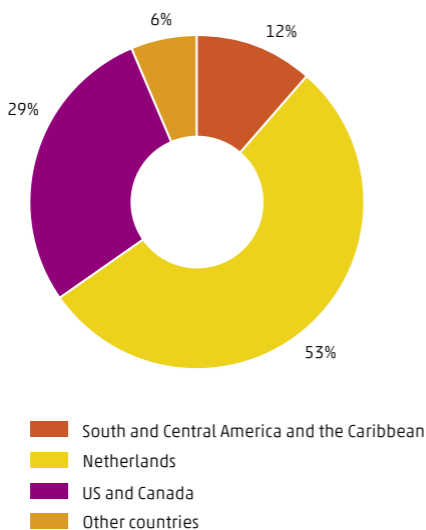
Age class (years)



3.17 Country of birth of inhabitants of Saba, 1 January 2013



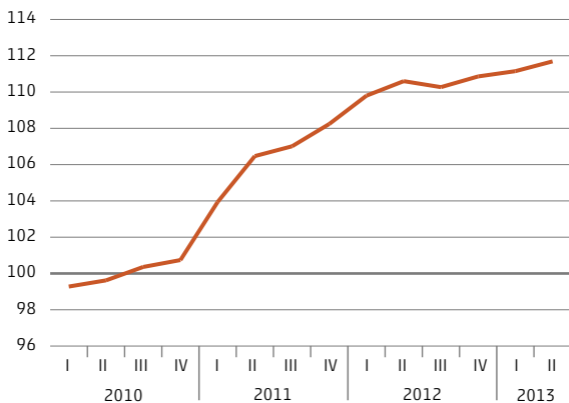
3.18 First nationality of inhabitants of Saba, 1 January 2013



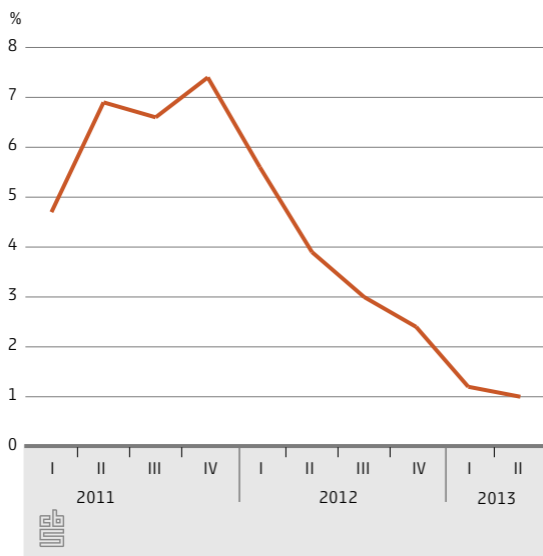
